




Manufacturers seek supportive framework conditions...

Risks linked to non compliant circuit breakers




Fatalities and injuries to consumers and their families

How?

Operations: At a local level with local actors

Identify potentially non-compliant products



Third parties sample and test products



If products non-compliant, relevant market surveillance authorities are alerted and informed



Authorities decide if enforcement measures will be taken against the responsible market operator



Timing

- The revised Low Voltage
 Directive on electrical safety,
 is applicable from the 20 April
 this year.
- → MSSI Electrical plans also to against other directives (ie EMC, REACH, RoHS etc)





Breadth and depth

- MSSI Electrical will be deployed in new countries in 2016: the Netherlands, Czech Republic, Romania,
 Denmark, Norway, Sweden and Finland
- □ Our objective is to cover the European Market
- MSSI Electrical wants to reach out to « sister » organisations horizontally and to reach out across the distribution chain






